Sept. 15

ASU's Scholarship Portal opens.

Search for scholarships you're eligible for in the upcoming fall semester and apply, then track your applications in the Scholarship Portal.

Priority application and ASU's FAFSA priority filing date.

Steps to receiving financial aid

01. Create an FSΔ ID.

Use the FSA ID you created at your previous institution to log in and legally sign Federal Student Aid documents (like the FAFSA) online. If you use your parent's tax information on your FAFSA, they'll need to create their own FSA ID in order to sign your FAFSA.

02.

Submit a FAFSA.

Apply before ASU's priority filing date to be considered for the most aid. The FAFSA is now open. Remember, FAFSA uses prior-prior year tax information. These are your taxes from 2020 or 2021, depending on aid year.

For spring 2023: Complete the 2022–2023 FAFSA. If you already completed the application, add ASU's Federal School

Code: 001081.

For fall 2023: Complete the 2023–2024 FAFSA. Application opens Oct. 1, 2022.

Complete your financial aid file.

If you are selected for financial aid verification, you will receive an email from ASU notifying you to check your **Priority Tasks** on My ASU for a list of requested items. **my.asu.edu**

04.

Apply for scholarships.

Use ASU's Scholarship Portal to filter scholarships to your specific criteria. You must complete an application for each scholarship. The portal allows you to store your information to save time when applying for multiple scholarships.

05.

Review your financial aid offer letter.

Once you're admitted to ASU, and only if you have submitted the FAFSA, you will receive your Financial Aid Notification outlining your financial aid package. To receive the full amount of aid you are eligible for, enroll full time (minimum 12 credits each semester) — any less and your award will be adjusted to match your cost of attendance.

Financial aid is your friend

Getting financial aid is easy. It all starts by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid at **fafsa.gov**. Begin gathering what you need now so you'll be ready to dive right in. File by Arizona State University's priority filing date to receive the most aid possible.

Why FAFSA?

The FAFSA gives you access to the nearly \$150 billion in need-based aid the U.S. Department of Education awards to students each year.

- Grants (money you don't repay).
- Federal Work-Study (money you earn from a student job).
- Low-interest federal loans (less expensive than private loans in the long run).

Steps to complete your FAFSA:

- 1. Go to fafsa.gov.
- 2. Log in using your FSA ID. (You'll create an FSA ID at **fsaid.ed.gov.**)
- Select the FAFSA application. For spring 2023 admission, select the 2022–2023 application. If your application is already on file, add ASU's Federal School Code 001081. For fall 2023 admission, select the 2023–2024 application.
- 4. Enter your personal information.
- Add ASU as a school selection (Federal School Code: 001081).
- Enter your parent or guardian's tax information, if you're a dependent. (Your parent will need an FSA ID too.)
- 7. Provide your financial information.
- 8. Sign your FAFSA with your FSA ID.

Here's what you'll need to complete your FAFSA:

- Federal Student Aid ID, which you'll create at fsaid.ed.gov.
- Social Security number.
- Driver's license.
- Bank statements.
- W-2 forms and tax returns from the 2020 (for incoming spring 2023), or 2021 (for incoming fall 2023) tax year. You may use an estimated income; however, ASU may require you to verify your income.
- Parent tax information, if you're a dependent.

Start applying for scholarships.

Scholarships aren't just for "A" students. There are opportunities based on talent, personal stories, creativity and more. You can search hundreds of scholarships in ASU's Scholarship Portal.

ASU offers a wide range of scholarship opportunities you can use to help pay for tuition, housing, books and other costs when you transfer to ASU. Apply as soon as possible, as scholarship deadlines vary.
